Deadly road risks

The winning film of the 2008 *Make A Film. Make A Difference* competition by Swinburne film and TV student, Matthew Goodrich explores the potentially deadly risks that young people take on the roads.

Goodrich's short film, *Death Blooms*, looks at how speaking up can change these life threatening situations.

"Before I began creating the film I thought to myself – what is it that truly scares me when I drive down Victoria's roads? What is it that would make me take my foot off of the pedal," Goodrich said.

"I think that road side memorials are great symbols of human loss that everyone can relate to. They are a constant reminder that people are losing their lives through reckless behaviour, sheer stupidity or just plain bad luck.

"While the film is quite left of field and abstract, I think it communicates this message effectively. I hope it will make people think twice before taking a risk on the road."

Death Blooms is currently being previewed in cinemas across Victoria.



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
