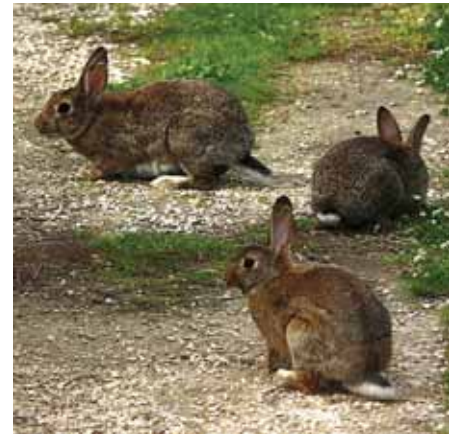
Queer

The Pinnacle Foundation is calling for scholarship applications from meritorious 16-24 year old LGBTIQ students who might need some help with their education costs. Set up to offer practical support for students who have suffered marginalisation and discrimination due to their sexual expression, these scholarships cover most study related expenses. Each student is also matched with a mentor who shares the same sexual expression, location and is an expert in the student's field of study. It provides financial assistance to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people who are or will be studying at a TAFE (certificate IV and above) or entry level university course in: Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health work, allied health (excluding pharmacy), dentistry/oral health (excluding dental assistants), medicine, midwifery, nursing.
